Founded in 1996 by a group of faculty from four different colleges, the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth Center for Portuguese Studies and Culture is a multidisciplinary international studies and outreach unit dedicated to the study of the language, literatures and cultures of the Portuguese-speaking world. The center is designed to be the liaison between the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth and other institutions involved in Portuguese studies both in the United States and abroad. The center aims to develop pedagogical materials to aid in teaching and learning Portuguese language and cultures, and supports the development and dissemination of knowledge regarding the Portuguese-speaking communities in the United States.

The center publishes the semiannual scholarly journal *Portuguese Literary & Cultural Studies*, which has been positively reviewed in the *Times Literary Supplement* and the *Washington Post*. The center also publishes the Adamastor Book Series, the Portuguese in the Americas Series, and the Portuguese Language Textbook Series. The center further sponsors and organizes colloquia, concerts, art exhibitions, dance performances and theatrical productions, in addition to visits by distinguished authors and critics.

Recently, the center led the effort to found the Affonso "Ferreira Mendes" Ferreira Portuguese-American Archives Endowment. In 2001, the center developed the Hélio and Amélia Pedroso/Luso-American Development Foundation Endowed Chair in Portuguese Studies. In 2000, the center played a leading role in the creation of the Department of Portuguese.

The varied activities of the Center for Portuguese Studies and Culture, including the Summer Program in Portuguese, which was begun in 1994, are made possible by the commitment and generosity of many individual and institutional supporters, including the Luso-American Foundation of Lisbon, the Foreign Ministry of the Government of Portugal, and the Portuguese-American legislative caucus in the Massachusetts State House.
